


Keller Army Community Hospital Friday, February 5, 2021 COVID-19 vaccine update

The COVID Vaccine Task Force will be administering "Dose 2" for all identified Phase 1A personnel on February 4-5, 2021, at Keller Army Community Hospital. All "Dose 2" personnel MUST bring their CAC card and CDC COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card to the vaccination site.



Only Phase 1B personnel (USMA educators and other frontline workers) that have been notified by their vaccine coordinator will receive their "Dose 1" vaccination on February 9-10, 2021, at Eisenhower Hall.

The Phase 1B population – mentioned in the above paragraph – will receive notification of date and time from their <u>unit vaccine coordinators</u> and/or <u>chain of command</u>. If you are in the Phase 1B population and have any questions, please contact your <u>vaccine coordinator</u> and/or <u>chain of command</u>.

The vaccinations at Ike Hall will not accept wall-ins; and the Keller Appointment Center IS NOT scheduling appointments for the COVID-19 vaccine.

To date, the Keller Medical team has vaccinated nearly 1,200 personnel in Phase 1A and 1B, which includes healthcare personnel, emergency responders, and frontline workers. The "Dose 1" vaccination of Phase 1B is ongoing.

When Keller receives the designated vaccine allotments, we will begin to schedule the Phase 1C population. Once the Phase 1C population is vaccinated, we will proceed with the Phase 2 population.

Currently, we do not have a specific date/time of the arrival of the vaccine allotment(s) nor do we have a date/time of vaccination for the Phase 1C or Phase 2 population group. We will make every effort to notify the Phases 1c and 2 population groups when we have the vaccine and are ready to administer the vaccination to these respective groups.

Health Care, Emergency, and Safety Personnel, and Other Essential and Critical Groups



Sub-tier 1



Emergency room, urgent care centers, and first responders (i.e., police, search and rescue, and fire personnel), and Armed Forces Retirement Home residents

Health care and support personnel at military hospitals and clinics, along with other non-clinical staff authorized to receive vaccine from DoD, who support patient care with a high risk of exposure or potential to interface with COVID-19 positive cases



Sub-tier 2



Outpatient health care and support personnel, including National Guard and Reserve personnel as well as active duty service members deploying or supporting COVID-19 response operations in Title 10 or Title 32 duty status



PHASE 1B

- National critical capabilities (strategic and nuclear deterrence forces, homeland defense)
- Personnel preparing to deploy to locations outside of the continental U.S. (OCONUS)
- Personnel preparing to deploy within the next three months, including military civilian and contractors authorized to receive immunization from the DoD
- New! Beneficiaries age 75 or older
- New! Front Line Essential Workers: Education and youth and child services staff sector. eligible defense manufacturing, DoD corrections staff, DoD postal service staff, DoD public transit workers, Commissary and other installation food service or agricultural workers



PHASE 1C

- New! Eligible beneficiaries age 65-74 years
- New! Eligible beneficiaries age 16-64 with increased risk for severe illness as defined by the CDC
- OSD, Agencies, field activities, Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Space Force, U.S. Coast Guard, and Reserve Component designated as key, essential, or mission-essential
- DoD Prisoners



Remaining Population



Healthy uniform personnel, other TRICARE beneficiaries, and those not otherwise mentioned above
