How is the COVID vaccination progressing at Keller???

Keller Army Community Hospital is currently providing the COVID-19 vaccine to the "Phase 1B" population, which includes (a) personnel preparing to deploy to locations outside of the continental United States, (b) personnel preparing to deploy within the next three months, including civilian employees and contractors authorized to receive immunizations from the DoD, (c) beneficiaries age 75 and older, and (d) front line essential workers to include education and youth and child services staff, DoD postal service staff, DoD public transit workers, and commissary and other installation food service workers.

Prior to this population, Keller vaccinated the Phase 1A population, which included health care providers and staff, first responders, emergency services and public safety personnel, and service members supporting the national COVID-19 response.

Operation Immune Knight, West Point's vaccine distribution plan, will continue to vaccinate the 'phased populations' in order as described in the DoD Population Schema. Keller is making preparations to vaccinate the Phase 1C population – beneficiaries between 65-74 years old, high-risk beneficiaries including all immunocompromised persons, and essential personnel not previously included in Phase 1A or 1B.

Keller will begin scheduling the Phase 1C population for vaccination when (1) all Phase 1A and 1B population, who opted to receive the vaccine, have been vaccinated; and (2) we receive additional allotments of the COVID vaccine.


If you are a TRICARE-insured beneficiary and you receive your care at Keller, you will be notified (in accordance with the DoD Population Schema), by our appointment center, when the vaccine is available and we will schedule an appointment at the time of the notification.


There is no need to call the hospital, no registration is needed, and it is requested that you do not show up at the hospital, for the vaccine, unscheduled/without an appointment.

The majority of the West Point population, to include the Corps of Cadets and beneficiaries that do not fall into the categories above, are included in Phase 2, which we hope to begin in the late Winter/early Spring timeframe.






